## MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT ROSSINGTON MEMORIAL HALL AT 7.00 pm on TUESDAY 12 APRIL 2016

### 4528. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION

Cllr B Johnson opened the meeting and welcomed Cllrs, Members of the Public and Ros Jones, elected Mayor of Doncaster to the meeting.

### 4529.

**PUBLIC:** Issues were raised about the number of lorries going up and down West End Lane, using the parking bay as a passing point.

**MAYOR:** Lots of discussion are taking place between the Police, Doncaster MBC including Highways and Planning, the Environment Agency, Ward Cllrs and the Parish Council to find the best solution. We are taking this seriously. We will report back to the Parish Council as we report back to the Ward Cllrs to keep them up to date. By working together we will bring about solutions. We've now got them all round the table accepting responsibility.

**CLLR:** We've been writing to the Senior Planning Office since November 2015. We've provided clear evidence but these departments have said they've been down there and there's not problems. I suggest to investigate these departments.

**MAYOR:** I came down here last week myself, I saw a DMBC van so they are monitoring the site.

**CLLR:** Residents need to see the presence of agencies so they know something is being done in the short-term

**PUBLIC:** Why don't all companies on Bankwood Lane fund the road from the spur at the roundabout?

**MAYOR:** There are talks in the process with major businesses on Bankwood Lane but that is a long-term solution. On 10 March a Breach of Condition Order was served on Attero Recycling for working outside their permitted hours which came into force on 8 April 2016.

**PUBLIC:** Why is the building of the spur road a long-term solution?

**MAYOR:** There are four possible routes for the road, funding needs to be sought. The link road was put in via FARRRS and was funded by the private sector along with Sheffield City Region. The FARRRS link road has taken 18 years to come about.

**PUBLIC:** Is that the timetable for the spur road?

**MAYOR:**No! Discussions are already taking place with major players here. The iPort is about transporting goods out of this country, it's a long-term investment to stimulate the area along with the housing it will grow good jobs for the people in this area.

**PUBLIC:** What time are the lorries supposed to start in a morning?

**CLLR:** The Environment Agency set the permit for each business.

**W. CLLR:** Six months ago Attero increased their tonnage from 75,000 tonnes to 250,000 tonnes a year. It is the Company's responsibility to inform Planning. The Environment Agency found lots of problems.

**MAYOR:**They will have to submit a Planning Proposal that will have to take into account impact on Highways and the Environment. I will get a copy of the proposal for the Parish Council. Our Enforcement Team is collating evidence.

**CLLR:** Who authorised the increased in tonnage?

**MAYOR:**It should be the Environment Agency, I will get our Planners to talk to them but whilst they are in pre-submission stage so cannot comment.

**CLLR:** It is the responsibility of the Company to say they have varied their licence.

**MAYOR:**Are you saying Planning put it through without a proper impact assessment?

**W.CLLR:** Yes

**MAYOR:** I will take that back and it will come back to the Parish Council.

**PUBLIC:** The new spur road is not very wide so they will have to swing wide to get in the gate.

**PUBLIC:** The footpaths on Bankwood/Lane Crescent are dangerous. It's just forgotten!

**PUBLIC:** I'm a resident on West End Lane, my concern is safety. Residents of Bankwood Lane park on West End Lane as they have received tickets for parking on their grass verges. This has turned that part of West End Lane into a single track carriageway. We've got all the lorries going up and down West End Lane plus all the traffic coming from the new link road. In the short-term I'd like a solution for this.

**PUBLIC:** Is the lorry park legal?

**CLLR:** Yes, it's licenced.

**PUBLIC:** There is an accident waiting to happen!

**MAYOR:**The 20mph has been put there to safeguard our children. It's needed. An external team will be coming round ticketing offenders.

**PUBLIC:** Why isn't there a pedestrian crossing there?

**CLLR:** We've been asking for one for years!

**MAYOR:**The Clerk to write to the relevant department.

**CLLR:** I'm concerned that businesses may leave Bankwood Lane because they aren't able to operate.

**CLLR:** I propose we invite Attero, Morris Metals, Tanks and Vessels and other key businesses to a meeting with the Parish Council.

**RESOLVED** to note the Clerk to arrange a meeting with key businesses on Bankwood Lane proposed by C Beaumont, seconded by A Harper.

#### **4530. ANNOUNCEMENTS**

A Harper and D Harper met with Lee Jepson and Dave Barnard from Attero on Monday 11 April 2016:

- Attero took over from Bowland Skip Hire but they had too many complaints so that is why they are now Attero Recycling Ltd.
- Attero have informed all their drivers that they must adhere to a 10 mph speed limit on Bankwood Lane and 20 mph speed limit through the village.
- Attero have hired the lorry park because of complaints about lorries parking up on West End Lane.

- Attero do not operate outside the hours of 7.30 am and 5.00 pm.
- They've had a lot of complaints from a resident on Bankwood Lane so they organised windows to be cleaned, the road to be swept and pot holes to be filled.
- Household waste comes in then goes to landfill or is baled to sell as energy.
- They have a licence to take building rubble.
- They are in constant touch with the Environment Agency and Doncaster MBC.
- The now have all the paperwork in place to go international.
- The big pile of rubbish has nothing to do the Attero.
- Attero spray all the incoming rubbish with a chemical to keep the smell down.
- Attero need to buy a piece of land from Harworth Estates to enable them to complete the road from the stump on the small roundabout on the new link road.
- There are over 40 people employed at Attero, the majority local people from Rossington with more jobs coming up if the office building is built.
- Attero and employees support local businesses
- Attero is willing to work in partnership with Rossington Parish Council
