4914. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION

Cllr A Harper opened the meeting and welcomed Cllrs and Members of the Public to the meeting.

4915. PUBLIC SESSION

4916. TO RECEIVE INSPECTOR MARK PAYLING

- Holmescarr Road will go on the list of roads in Rossington where the speed cameras and PCSOs will concentrate on speeding traffic.
- J Cooke to petition Highways re the lights at Junction 3 for traffic coming from junction 4.
- The Clerk to write to Highways re the traffic build up at junction 3 from traffic coming from junction 4.
- By January Mark will have 5 Police Officers with Rossington having a dedicated officer who will attend Parish Council meetings. The Officers will be able to look into the issues of quad bikes and motorcycles. There will also be an increase of up to 15 PCSOs.
- Mark explained that one person committing commercial and domestic burglaries had been sentenced but another person had been bailed.
- The Police record every incident. Crime statistics are now being made available in an easier to understand format.

These events are put on in partnership with YLCA and Community First Yorkshire. The Plunkett Foundation is a National Organisation based in Oxford. They have 16 staff who offer all kinds of support to community groups who wish to take over and run a community project such as a pub, shop, woodland, farm, distillery, community hall, etc.

They offer:

- Business advice
- Mentoring/visits
- Training
- Events
- Networking
- Signposting
- Support with legal structures and community shares
- One to one advice
- Support with funding

They have supported:

52 pubs who are trading with 111 in the pipeline

350 shops trading with many more in the pipeline

85 distilleries trading with 76 in the pipeline

53 Farms trading with 21 in pipeline

7 Woodlands trading with 50 in pipeline

The Plunkett Foundation has a great track record so if the Parish Council agrees, as and when it is needed, we could sign up to get their support throughout the whole process from the asset transfer of a building, deciding what is the best legal structure and governance to community consultation, grant funding and so on.
